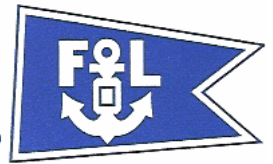

MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION INFORMATION

PLEASE READ COMPLETELY

SPONSOR INFORMATION

Sponsoring a prospective member is an important step that should not be taken lightly. While we are far from an elitist organization, the fact that the clubhouse operates as a key club without paid staff makes it necessary to determine that applicants are persons of good character. Will the prospect have the time and interest to fulfill the requirements of membership? Fifty hours of service the first year is not a method of free labor, but rather, a device to introduce the member to the club. The Probationary hours are not for sale, but must be earned. We serve no one by letting their membership die for lack of probationary hours. Explain the Work or Pay rule that requires twelve hours of service each year.

Show your prospect around the clubhouse; explain what and who we are. Bring them to a membership meeting. Their application cannot be read to the membership until they attend at least one meeting with one of their sponsors.

As sponsor you will receive a letter asking you to explain why your prospect will be a good member, please complete and return it promptly.

Finally, as sponsor, you are your prospect's mentor. Serve them well.

PROSPECTIVE MEMBER INFORMATION

Talk to your sponsor about the Fond du Lac Yacht Club; have them explain the requirements of membership. You will be required to complete fifty hours of service to the club during your first year of membership, everyone must do this and your first year dues and initiation fee are NOT refundable if you fail. In the event of a Joint / Regular applicant the work requirement is reduced for the second applicant. You are also expected to provide twelve hours of service to the club each year after your first. This is a work or pay rule, and there are some exceptions.

Applications must be received by the Membership Secretary prior to the Board of Director's meeting (usually the last Thursday of the month) for processing and

presentation to the Board. You may be asked to meet with a screening committee prior to the processing of your application. Your application will then be read to the Membership at the next Regular Meeting. The application is then posted in the clubhouse for at least 28 days. If no serious objections are raised to the application, the applicant is then voted upon at the next Membership Meeting. Your one year Probationary Membership begins at this time. You will be Indoctrinated, receive your membership booklet, and door key at that time.

The attached excerpts of the club by-laws are for your information. Keep them! Return only the application, the required proof of boat ownership, and payment.

Upon Indoctrination, you will receive a complete copy of the by-laws, policies, house rules, and a membership roster.

Above all, we want you to enjoy the Fond du Lac Yacht Club, but we must share the work as well as the fun. If you are willing, hop aboard!

APPLICATION INFORMATION

Complete the application, be as accurate as possible. Information about your boat is important, this is a yacht club. Be sure, in the future, to keep this information up-to-date as only boat owners (with some exceptions) are voting members. Include a copy of your boat documentation, boat title, or certificate of number. New members must be boat owners. Also include payment of THREE HUNDRED FIFTEEN (\$315.00) as payment of your current year dues (\$157.50) and initiation fee (\$157.50). In the event that this is the application of the spouse of a current or prospective member (Joint/ Regular Member) include only the current year dues (\$157.50). Dues and Initiation fees must accompany the application.

Membership Policy

The governing rules of the Fond du Lac Yacht Club, Inc., are the By Laws. The application form itself, and this policy statement are interpretive policy of those By Laws and do not supercede them in any way. This is intended to answer the most frequently asked questions by prospective members and assist them in deciding whether or not to seek membership.

1. **Membership Process.** As explained in the letter acknowledging the application there are steps taken leading toward a membership vote accepting one into Probationary membership. The application must be reviewed by the Screening Committee and Board of Directors prior to being presented at a membership meeting, listing in our monthly newsletter and posting on the bulletin board for twenty-eight days. During this time, the prospective member's references and sponsors are contacted and there may be a meeting with the Screening Committee, Board of Directors or both. This entire process takes five to eight weeks depending upon receipt of the application. The Board of Directors meets the last Thursday of each month. Of primary concern is demonstration of boat ownership, interest in safe recreational boating on Lake Winnebago and the comments of sponsors and references. Those persons who aspire to Yacht Club membership but have no sponsors are encouraged to join one of the auxiliary clubs. This is a good way to get to know members and eventually gain sponsorship. Information on the Boating Club, Sailing Club, Ice Yachters, U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and Nautigals can be requested from any member. The primary contacts are listed on an information sheet by the bar phone at the Yacht Club. These organizations are all independent entities but hold their meetings at the Yacht club and are comprised mostly of Yacht Club members.
2. **Classes of Membership.** There are several classes of membership including Life and Honorary fully described in the By Laws. Each class has its own rights and responsibilities. Those classes which can be applied for are *Regular Membership*, and *Joint Regular Membership*. During the first year leading to regular membership, the prospective member will be a *Probationary Member*.
 - a. **Regular Membership.** This category of membership comprises the vast majority of the membership of the Club. To attain this status, one must be a boat owner over twenty-one who satisfies the Board of interest in boating and support of the Yacht Club and its purposes. Regular Members have full voting rights if they attend three meetings per year and maintain ownership of a boat. Voting rights are lost after two years without a boat. Certain age and length of service requirements form exceptions to this. Regular Members are required to perform twelve hours of service each year including credit of one hour each for meeting attendance.
 - b. **Joint Regular Membership.** The legally married spouse of a Regular Member can become a Joint Regular Member. Rights and obligations including the vote, dues and twelve hour service rule apply. No initiation fee nor fifty hours of probationary service are required. Wisconsin Marital Property Rights statutes provide that if a boat is owned by either spouse, it is owned by both in the absence of other mutual agreements between the parties.
 - c. **Probationary Membership.** During the first year of membership, Regular Members are Probationary Members. After indoctrination they have full rights of membership and are required to perform fifty hours of service. The primary purpose of the service time is to gain knowledge about the Club, its members, facilities and procedures. A Probationary Member's spouse can contribute to the service time requirement. For couples jointly applying for Regular Membership and Joint Regular Membership, only one spouse need fulfill the fifty-hour requirement. In short, the two must serve sixty-two hours between them. Both will be considered as Probationary Members. After one year of probationary service and upon recommendation of the Indoctrination Committee, a voice vote is taken to make Probationary Members Regular or Joint Regular Members.
3. **Indoctrination.** Following the vote into Probationary Membership, a two-hour indoctrination session will be scheduled. During this session, Club procedures and facilities will be demonstrated and explained. The key card will be issued **only** at this Indoctrination session.

ARTICLE V – MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. ADMISSION OF MEMBERS: No citizen under the age of 21 may become a member, other than an honorary member. A written application must be prepared by all applicants setting forth such data as may from time to time be required on the forms authorized and/or approved by the Board of Directors. Each application shall bear the signature of two Voting members as sponsors and shall be accompanied by the initiation fee as determined by the Board of Directors from time to time. Dues for the current year shall also accompany the application if such application is submitted before October 1st. All such applications and deposits shall be delivered to the Secretary prior to commencement of the screening and review by the Board of Directors at the next meeting or thereafter. Following receipt of the application, the applicant's name shall be:

- a. Posted on the Fond du Lac Yacht Club bulletin board for at least twenty-eight days, AND
- b. Included in a bulletin of the regular publication of the Fond du Lac Yacht Club, Inc., mailed to all voting members before being voted upon.

The Board of Directors may establish a Screening Committee composed of such members as it may designate from time to time to review applications for membership. To assist any such Screening Committee, all members are urged to present adverse comments prior to the Board of Directors approval. Upon such review as the Board of Directors deems satisfactory, and upon compliance with the notice requirements set forth above, the application shall be acted upon at the next Regular Meeting of Voting Members or at such meeting thereafter as the application may be heard.

The applicant may be required to meet with the Screening committee or with the Board of Directors. Additionally the applicant must attend at least one (1) Regular Meeting accompanied by at least one (1) of the applicant's Voting Member sponsors before the application may be acted upon.

All applicants shall be deemed to warrant that they have not been convicted of a felony except as may be disclosed in writing on the application. The Board of Directors or the Screening Committee, at their option, may reject any application if the applicant has been convicted of a felony.

All applicants who:

- a. Meet each and every requirement for membership, and
- b. Who obtain an approving majority vote of the voting Members in attendance at the meeting where the application is acted upon shall be accorded membership to the category herein provided.

If any applicant is not accorded membership, then upon written request, such applicant shall be entitled to have his/her application reviewed by the Board of Directors. Upon such review, the Board of Directors may either reject further consideration of the application or in the alternative, cause the application to be reconsidered by the Voting Members.

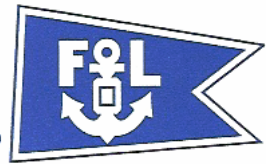
The classes of membership shall be as follows: (*see By Laws*)

SECTION 2. PROBATION: Upon admission, a new Regular Member (but not including the spouse qualifying as a Joint/Regular Member) shall remain in a probationary status for one year during which he/she shall be required to perform a uniform period of service set by the Voting Members. In the event service is not performed during such probationary period, together with any extension granted by the Board of Directors, his/her membership will automatically terminate without refund of initiation fee or annual dues.
